Saint Paul Public Schools recognizes the benefits of early childhood education. Many schools have programs for 4-year-olds to help them prepare for success in kindergarten. Children who are 4 years old by September 1, 2009, are eligible to attend a program in the 2009-2010 school year. Most programs for 4-year-olds have 2-1/2 hour long classes, five days a week. Families must be residents of Saint Paul to enroll. Proof of address will be requested.

Please be sure to complete the entire application. Check the preferences to make sure you are eligible. If you have questions about a program at a specific school, please call the school. EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

Early Childhood Screening should be scheduled for children between the ages of 3 and 5 years old. The screening is required by state law for all kindergarteners and is recommended for 4-year-old pre-kindergarten students before starting school. This screening includes a review of immunization and health information, and screening of vision, hearing, height, weight, speech and development. The school district offers this screening at no cost to families. This screening can also be arranged with the child's doctor or health clinic. Screening is recommended for children when they are between 3 and 4 years old for early identification of any concerns that may interfere with learning.

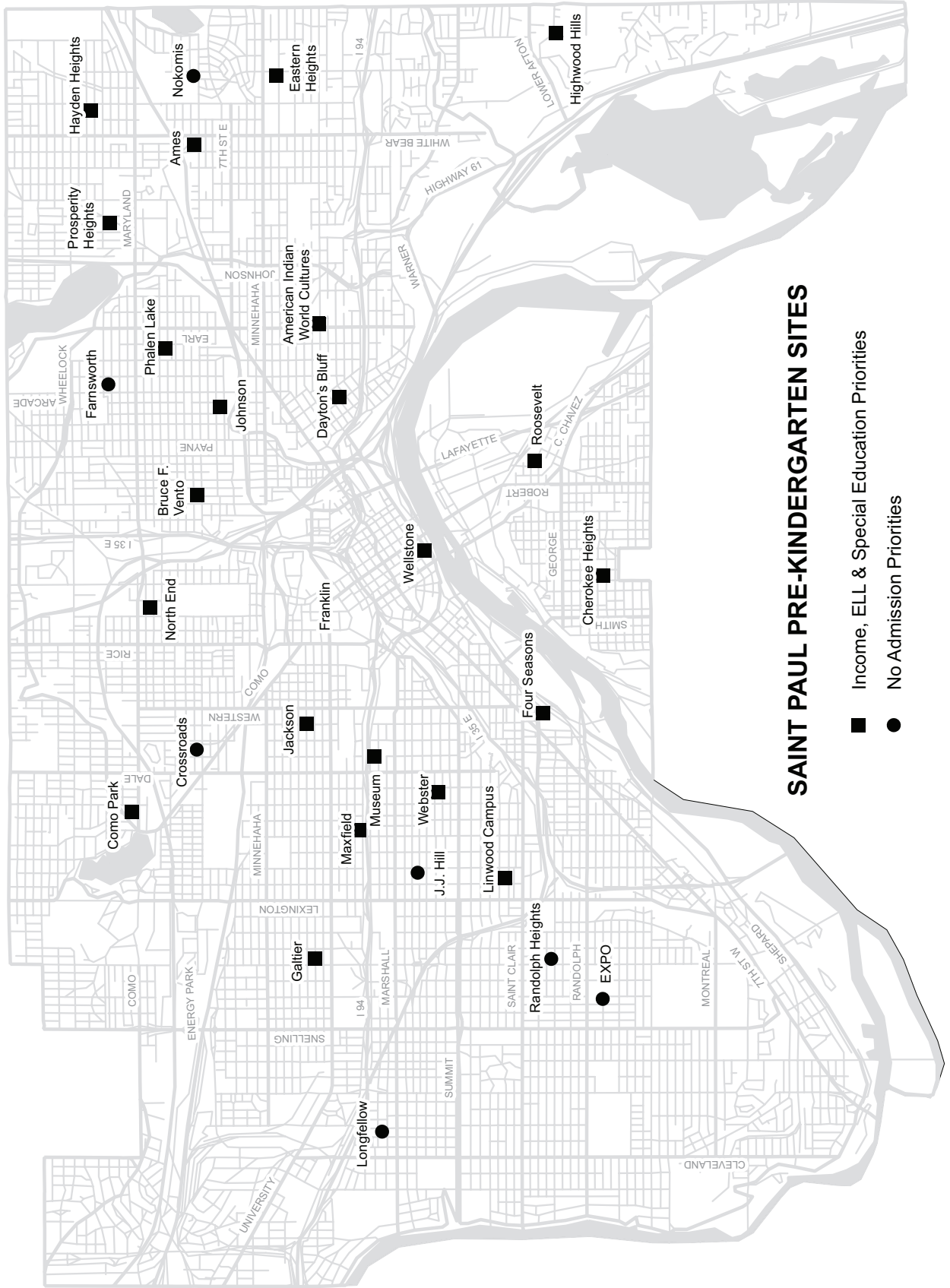
TRANSPORTATION

Saint Paul Public Schools provides transportation to students who are eligible under state regulations and Saint Paul Board of Education policies. Generally, a student is eligible for transportation if the student lives within the school attendance area and is at least one walking mile from school. A walking mile refers to a one-mile distance when a student walks on city streets taking the shortest route from his/her home to school. In most cases, transportation is also provided to Saint Paul students living more than one walking mile from the magnet/citywide option or secondary school they attend. Call the schools you are considering to find out if your student is eligible for transportation based on where you live.
