Project REACH is a Saint Paul Public Schools shelter and street-based program that promotes school stability and academic success of homeless children and youth. Our program staff serve pre-K and school age children who are in temporary housing situations.

Fostering Connections is a Saint Paul Public Schools program that assists with the education stability of students placed in out-of-home care.

If a family is experiencing homelessness, they should call 211 to access shelter options in Ramsey County

- Coordinated Access to Housing and Shelter will assess the situation to help find the best housing options

Remind parents to contact your school in the fall if they continue to experience homelessness. We can help with transportation, but also with backpacks, uniforms, and school supplies. All students must be re verified

Project REACH

- 1801 Students eligible for McKinney Vento services
 - 729 (40%) Students in grades 1-5
 - 784 (44%) Students in grades 6-12
- 2042 Students served by Project REACH staff
- 1202 (67%) Students "doubled up" with family or friends due to lack of housing
- 305 (17%) Students live in shelters
- 1261 (70%) Students identify as African American
- 1660 (92%) Students identify as African American, Asian or Pacific Islander, American Indian or Hispanic
- 155 (9%) Students are unaccompanied youth
- 830 hours of tutoring sessions at varied shelters

Fostering Connections

- 281 Students in Foster Care
- 171 (61%) Students identify as African American
- 240 (85%) Students identify as African American, Asian or Pacific Islander, American Indian or Hispanic
- 96 (34%) Students in grades 1-5
