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SPPS Districtwide Career Pathway Center

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The following classes are being offered next year at Highland Park High School but are also for college credit. They need to be Juniors and Seniors and please see the requirements below.

Intro to Business (Saint Paul College) Grades 11-12 3 credits

Requirements: 2.8 unweighted GPA

This St. Paul College course taught at Highland Park High School introduces students to the world of business and helps prepare them for the roles of consumer, worker and citizen. The class will assist students in consumer decision-making, prepare for future employment, and help them effectively perform responsibilities as a citizen. This course will build a knowledge base for other business courses such as Marketing, Entrepreneurship, Accounting, Finance, Management, and Banking and Credit. This class is a great way to get started learning how the business world works!

This 3 credit course is taught by a credentialed high school teacher and recorded on a college transcript.

Introduction to Healthcare (Bethel University). 3 Credits

Requirements: GPA 3.0 but will take an educators' recommendation if not

An introduction to various health professions and the healthcare system in the United States. Emphasis on understanding the healthcare system, current issues in healthcare, and healthcare career paths. Development of healthcare literacy and navigating healthcare culture. Students examine education, training, and licensure and/or certification requirements for potential careers.

Introduction to Urban Education (Minneapolis College) 3 credits

Requirements: Must be in the top third of class for juniors and top 50% of class for seniors

This Minneapolis College course taught at Highland Park High School gives high school students perspectives on the rewards of teaching in diverse schools and communities. Students will examine their own socializations, as well as examine and challenge personal and structural systems as it relates to the classroom. Course topics will include a historical survey of schooling in the United States, as well as rich discussions on educational philosophies. Current issues facing urban P-12 students, teachers, schools, districts, and communities will be discussed. Students will learn strategies for working with and engaging families and communities. Various types of reflection will be introduced as important means for continual professional growth to meet the needs of urban learners. This 3 credit course is taught by a credentialed high school teacher and recorded on a college transcript.
