Celebrations and Progress for 2020-21 (Strategic Plan year 3)

- Launched Personal Learning Plan tool for K-12 students
- Finalized initial design of Career Pathway Guide
- Internships aligned to SPPS Career Pathways from *SPPS Achieves*
 - 43 students from 9 SPPS high schools earned over \$24,000
 - 93% students of color
 - 18 employer partners
 - over 50% supervisors are people of color
- Seven comprehensive high schools have courses projected for four Career Pathways and have at least two Career Pathways implemented
- Piloted ninth grade Career Integration into the core subjects
 - Each content area had a post-secondary and industry partner

Coming next in 2021-2022 (Strategic Plan year 4)

- Roll out Career Pathway Guide
- Roll out parent portal in Xello (where Personal Learning Plans are housed)
- Launch 4-year course planner for eighth and ninth graders
- Seven comprehensive high schools roll out four career pathways
- All ninth grade core content teachers will embed the career integration lessons and tie students' learning back to their Personal Learning Plan, and provide the opportunity for students to take a related externship
- Plans to expand district offerings in the medical field along with internship opportunities
- Pilot Career Integration lessons in 10-12th grade core content areas
