<p>Our school communicates with families in many ways.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>School Newsletter</u>: emailed to families the first Thursday of every month; during in-person learning, sent home in Thursday communication folders when emailing is not an option; paper copies are available upon request • <u>Classroom Newsletters</u>: weekly, biweekly, and monthly (varies by grade level); newsletters are emailed to families; during in-person learning, sent home in backpacks when emailing is not an option; paper copies are available upon request • <u>PTA Notes</u>: newsletters from the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) are prepared, as needed, to communicate upcoming events, announcements and other important PTA related information; sent home in communication folders or electronically during Distance Learning • <u>Communication Folders</u>: containing student work and school wide informational flyers are, during in-person learning, sent home weekly in student backpacks on Thursdays; families should return communication folders to the teacher before the following Thursday • <u>Student Planners</u>: used during in-person learning as an organizational tool for students in several grade 1 – 5 classrooms; method for two-way communication between families and teachers to keep families informed about their specific child’s homework and progress; planner should be used by families to communicate daily transportation changes to teachers

- Family Handbook: contains important information for families and is emailed to families in September; posted on the school's website and available in the office

- Informational Posters: displayed in school entrance areas to provide visual references containing details of all school events when in-person events are allowed
- Email Communication: HPE teachers and administrators regularly email families regarding their students, school events and general announcements; to ensure important information is received, families should contact the school office if their email address changes
- Automated Phone Calls: used as a way to make important school related announcements, including evening bus delays of more than thirty minutes
- Text Communication: used to invite families to participate in school events and activities, as well as for general announcements; to ensure important information is received, families should contact the school office if their phone number changes; teachers are encouraged to use apps for communicating with families via text
- PTA Electronic Communication: the PTA emails families regarding events, fundraisers, meetings, volunteer opportunities and other important matters; PTA maintains a social media site for PTA related announcements

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Family Directory</u>: Families receive an electronic Google directory form in the fall to opt in to the directory; only the contact information that families choose to provide on the form is included in the directory; the directory gives the families a way to communicate and connect outside of school and serves as a method to help build community • <u>Response Time</u>: HPE staff will do their best to respond to calls, emails and notes from families within 24-48 hours
<p>The achievement gap, or rather the “opportunity gap,” between students of color and white students in Saint Paul Public Schools is unacceptable. Our school is working to change practices and systems by identifying the barriers that make it harder for students of color to succeed and for their families to support their learning.</p>	<p>Highland Park Elementary is implementing the following practices in 2020-21 to increase student achievement</p> <p>Small group intervention in Math, Math Review, Guided Reading, Fountas & Pinnell Phonics, Spelling, Word Study Lessons program in grades K – 2 and social-emotional learning</p> <p>HPE has an equity team that meets monthly to discuss racial disparities in academics and behavior. The team looks for way to interrupt the predictability of how race shows up in the reports and test scores.</p>
<p>Transitions between schools can be challenging, and we work to help families as their children start and leave our school.</p>	<p>For new students and families, we support the transition by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Summer Play Group</u>: During in-person learning, families of incoming students are given the opportunity at the spring orientation night to sign up to participate; when face to face contact is safe, the group meets at the school’s playground on set dates to give families and incoming students the opportunity to get to know each other during the summer months leading up to the first day of school • <u>Fall Classroom Virtual Open Houses</u>: September 3, 2020 an opportunity for students and families to meet their new teacher and connect with their classmates virtually • <u>Goal-setting Conferences</u>: allows students in 5th grade and their parents and caregivers to meet with their teacher virtually in September 2020 and set academic and social goals for the school year • <u>Pre-K and Kindergarten Conferences</u>: September 8 & 9, 2020 allows students, families and classroom teachers to get to know each other and discuss what school will look like during Distance Learning • <u>Family Handbooks</u>: a useful resource for new families • <u>PTA Family Events</u>: provide opportunities for families to get to know each other and learn more about HPE throughout the year when in-person events are safe and allowed • <u>Community Outreach</u>: families of children attending local ECFE and Head Start preschool programs are invited to attend various family nights as a way to introduce them to our school and programs

- Pre-K and Kindergarten Orientation: Spring, 2021, specifically for our incoming Pre-K and Kindergarten students and their families
- During in-person learning, Pre-K students visit Kindergarten classrooms in late spring as a way to prepare them for what Kindergarten will look and feel like when they return in the fall
- During in-person learning, Kindergarten students visit first grade classrooms in late spring to see the rooms, meet the teachers and hear a story about moving on to first grade
- End of Year Picnic: June 10, 2021, incoming families are invited to attend the picnic to allow them an opportunity to meet other HPE families

For students and families moving to the next school in their pathway, we support the transition by:

- Highland Park Middle School Events: throughout the year, during in-person learning, HPMS invites HPE students to visit and participate in a variety of events, helping HPE students become familiar with the middle school building and experience being part of the middle school community
- Middle School Tours: HPE students are excused from elementary school to tour middle schools of their choice
- Middle School Registration Open House Nights: 5th grade students are encouraged to attend spring 2021 open house registration events at the middle school they will be attending for 6th grade
- 5th Grade Exhibiton: In the final year of the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP), 5th grade students at HPE participate in an extended, in-depth, collaborative project known as the PYP Exhibition. In the spring, 5th grade students present their work on Exhibition Day to other students and their families
- 5th Grade Celebration: held in June to honor the hard work and accomplishments of the 5th grade students as they complete their last year of elementary school and transition to middle school

Family Partnerships

Our school-parent compact establishes the shared responsibility for student success between the school, families, and students. Families and teachers work together to develop the compact.

There are many opportunities for families to build connections to the school and to each other.

- Annual Title I Meeting: October 19, 2020
HPE presents information about the Title 1 program and how these funds are used to support student achievement at our school
- PTA Meetings: PTA meets monthly; meeting dates can be found on the school calendar and the school's website; free childcare is available at all in-person meetings
- During in-person learning, HPE and HPE's PTA host family events throughout the school year including: Coffee Connection, Fall Festival, Disco Bingo, Cultural Night, Fun Run, and School Picnic
- Classroom Showcase Events: during in-person learning, families are invited into the classroom two times during the year, so students can showcase their work to their families
- Award Recognition Assemblies: each month, teachers select students to be recognized for student of the month, mountain climber, and students that have demonstrated the monthly learner profile; when safe, school-wide award assemblies are held in-person to recognize these students along with students who have had perfect attendance and classrooms who have earned the monthly cafeteria golden tray award; families of students who are receiving awards are notified and invited to attend that month's assembly; when in-person assemblies are not possible, awards are announced via a video that is shared on the first Monday of each month
- Home Visits: HPE has a social worker, a counselor, some teachers and a parent liaison trained in the Parent Teacher Home Visit Project; home visits are made when in-person contact is allowed

We work to make these meetings and events available for every family in the school.

- HPE has an English Learners (EL) Education Assistant (EA) who provides translation and interpreting for Oromo and Amharic families
- Hmong, Spanish, Somali, and other interpreters are available upon request
- Our EL teachers and EL EA work to get information to our EL families in a timely manner
- HPE has a language line account to access interpreters for any language needed
- Written and automated phone messaging communications are translated in other languages when required/necessary
- School communications to families include footnotes in other languages to indicate the information is available in a specific language upon request
- Bring Your Parent to Pre-K Day invitations and handouts are available in Spanish, Somali, Hmong, Karen and English
- Free childcare is provided for our monthly, in-person PTA meetings and any other special events that require parent participation without their child
- Transportation to school meeting and events is available upon request
- The school works to provide flexible meeting times and days of the week and when possible provide childcare, food and transportation to remove barriers to participation

Our school supports families as advocates and provides opportunities for parent leadership.

- Families are encouraged to email, call, or schedule a meeting with classroom teachers if they have questions or concerns regarding their child's learning; if after that they are not satisfied with the result, families should schedule a meeting with the principal
- Parents and caregivers are invited to participate in the PTA and attend monthly meetings to learn more about what is happening at HPE, support teachers and advocate for all HPE students
- Parents and caregivers are invited to provide input on HPE's School Continuous Improvement Plan (SCIP) three times a year
- Parents and caregivers are invited to participate in the Family Engagement Plan development and review; the PTA and school staff also provide input and review the draft before the plan is finalized
- Parents and caregivers are invited to participate in SPPS District Parent Advisory Councils and other school/district advisory focus groups
- Bring Your Parent to Pre-K Day and evening family circle events encourage parents and caregivers to be advocates
- HPE's Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) program builds advocacy with parents and caregivers

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • During in-person learning, teachers provide families with opportunities to volunteer in the classroom or chaperone field trips • During in-person learning, parents and caregivers are encouraged to volunteer in the classrooms and at school events; parents and caregivers should contact teachers directly to learn of classroom volunteer opportunities and to make arrangements to volunteer in the classrooms; parents and caregivers should contact the PTA’s Volunteer Coordinator at highlandparkel.pta@gmail.com to sign up to volunteer at PTA or school events • Families are surveyed at various events throughout the year for feedback and input on how to better meet their needs; survey results are shared with the school’s staff • Teachers and staff will be provided with information about working with families during a staff meeting

<p>Our school shares information about state standards, assessment and student achievement with families in multiple ways.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Report Cards</u>: Available to families through Parent Portal in November, March and June; families needing their User Name and Password should contact the school’s office at 651-293-8770; families may request a paper copy of their student’s report card as well • During in-person learning, several grade 1 - 5 classrooms have student planners, and these are used to communicate with families regarding specific learning goals, homework or areas of strengths and areas of growth specific to the individual student • <u>Student Led Parent-Teacher Fall Conferences</u>: November 10 – 20, 2020; teachers will work with their families to schedule a conference time during these dates • <u>Student Led Parent-Teacher Spring Conferences</u>: March 2021 • Families are encouraged to read daily with their children and to check in about what they are learning in school • The family handbook provides information on our International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Program (PYP) or you can find more information at ibo.org • During in-person learning, individual classrooms and grade levels have events throughout the year connected to the PYP, where families learn more about the standards and the curriculum, along with seeing their students engaged in learning • Monthly building newsletters provide information regarding curriculum and PYP

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Classroom newsletters provide grade level specifics around the content being studied • K-1 and EL Teachers utilize Raz-Kids, an online guided reading program with interactive ebooks and reading quizzes to test comprehension, for students to work on their reading at home • <u>See Saw</u>: Pre-Kindergarten through third grade teachers use this app for instructional purposes and to share student work with families • <u>Schoology</u>: Fourth and fifth grade teachers use this app for instructional purposes; families have access to see their child's work • Families are notified when their children receive support from Reading Corp (grades K-3) and Math Corps (grades 3-5) volunteers • HPE encourages families to help their students improve their reading comprehension by helping them make connections of what they are reading to what they already know; when families are reading with their children they are encouraged to ask them two questions: who are the main characters in the text? what is the story about?

<p>Many before- and after-school enrichment and support opportunities are available for students.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • During in-person learning, HPE offers Extended Day Learning (EDL) for students in grades 3 - 5 on Monday and Wednesday nights, including band, orchestra, drama and Lego League • During in-person learning, flyers with after-school Community Education class offerings held at schools near HPE are sent home in communication folders • During in-person learning, other school enrichment activities include: Spelling Bee, Geography Bee, Math Masters and Destination Imagination • Pre-K students may register for and attend evening ECFE classes with their families
