School Goals

Reading:

The percent of student scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 18% to 35% by Spring 2022 as measured by the MCA.

Math:

The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 16% to 35% by Spring 2022 as measured by the MCA.

In the 5th Grade Classroom

The fifth grade team will work with students and their families to support students' academic success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Fifth grade will work on reading comprehension and understanding different genres and text types as well as sustained reading with the goal of students reading for 40 minutes uninterrupted.
- Teachers will work to provide access to books for reading at home.
- 5th Grade students will need to solve real world math problems and word problems with multiple steps. ST Math will help students practice at their level.
- An IB Programme of Inquiry brochure will be sent home at the beginning of each of the six IB units.
- Fifth Grade will host an IB Exhibition event inviting the community to school to explore one of our IB units.
- Schoology will be used to share assignments, student work, and assessments with families.

At Home

Benjamin E. Mays IB World School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Make sure my child has enjoyable books to read.
- Ask my child about what they read: What is the main idea? Supporting details?
- Encourage my child to question as they read: Make predictions about what will happen next
- Support reading at home. Visit the library.
- Initial Reading Calendar.
- Work with my child on math homework Monday through Thursday.
- Attend the IB Exhibition event and look for the IB Programme of Inquiry brochures.
- Look for the *Weekly Highlights* email.
- Use Schoology to follow my child's classwork.

Benjamin E. Mays IB World School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Bring the classroom newsletter and IB brochures home and share with my family.
- Read for at least 20 minutes at home daily.
- Bring home bi-weekly progress report and show to my family.
- Bring homework home to complete Monday through Thursday and return it to school.
