During the 2020-2021 school year, Benjamin E. Mays IB World School will be focused on Student Voice, which is:

- including the opinions, beliefs, perspectives, and cultural backgrounds of students to increase their sense of agency and ownership.
- engaging students in learning experiences that encourage class discussion and academic discourse.
- supporting students in becoming more independent learners through productive struggle and an increased sense of self-efficacy.

Our school-wide approach to Student Voice includes our commitment to Restorative Practices, inquiry-based learning (IB), increased opportunities for students to explain and justify their thinking, and culturally responsive instruction grounded in relevance, relationships, and rigor.

School Goals

Reading:

The percent of student scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 18.4% to 35% by Spring 2021 as measured by the MCA.

Math:

The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 16% to 35% by Spring 2021 as measured by the MCA.

In the Kindergarten Classroom

The Kindergarten team will work with students and their families to support students' academic success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Literacy will focus on letter names, letter sounds, sight words, reading, and writing.
- Math will focus on number sense, patterns, counting to 100, addition and subtraction. 10-Frame activities will be used in the classroom and 10-Frame bookmarks will be provided to families.
- During Take Your Parent to School Days and Parent Teacher Conferences, parents will receive take home activities for their child to grow in math and literacy.
- Goal of 30 minutes sustained reading by the end of the year. Students will visit the school library and *Library Go!* St. Paul Public Library information will be provided to parents.
- An IB Programme of Inquiry brochure will be sent home at the beginning of each of the six IB units.
- Kindergarten will host an IB Showcase inviting the community to school to explore one of their IB units.
- Seesaw will be used to communicate and share work samples with families.

At Home

Benjamin E. Mays IB World School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic success. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Use the tools provided at Take Your Parent to School Days and conferences to work on literacy and math.
- Read together often!
- Visit the school website and check out the links
- Look for the classroom newsletter every week

- Use Seesaw to follow my child's classwork.
