**Notes on Attendance:** If your child misses school, please call us, email us or write a note stating the reason they missed school. If we do not hear from you, all absences are marked unexcused, so don't forget to communicate with us.

The following reasons will result in an excused absence - illness, doctor appointment, funeral, family emergency or religious holiday. If your child has 5-7 unexcused absences, they will be referred to a parent and student meeting with the SAM (Student Attendance Matters) program staff.

One final note: every time a student misses three classes (unexcused), it counts as a complete day missed, even if the classes are not on the same day.
