The achievement gap, or “opportunity gap” between students of color and white students in Saint Paul Public Schools is unacceptable. Our school is working to change practices and systems by identifying the barriers that make it harder for students of color to succeed and for their families to support their learning.

We recognize there is an achievement gap and have begun the process of identifying specific barriers that may be contributing to this gap. Our School Leadership Team uses our School Continuous Improvement Plan (SCIP) as a guiding document to analyze our students’ assessment data and grades. Each month, our Leadership Team critically views our students’ performance on assessments such as the MCAs and FAST and they look at students’ quarterly grade performance.

Our team reflects on and addresses why our students of color are not meeting proficiency standards. Currently, our achievement gap is most pronounced between our Caucasian and African American students. Our school is looking through an equity lens on how we can implement best practices to meet the learning needs of all our students.

We will be working to infuse culturally relevant teaching practices, while examining the realness, relevance, and rigor of our teaching practices. Our staff will also work to develop relationships with our students and families.

Transitions between schools can be challenging. We work to help families as their children start and leave our school.

For new students and families, we support the transition by offering:

- Fall Open House
- Spring Open House
- District Parent Workshops (Parent Academy)

For students and families moving to the next school in their pathway, we support the transition by:

- Step-Up Day for 4th graders. 4th graders go to Farnsworth 5-8 Campus and get to experience being a 5th grader.
- 5th and 6th – 8th grade new student registration night. Students and parents meet the teachers and receive a tour through the building.
- Where Everyone Belongs (W.E.B.) provides an orientation, mentorship and a smooth transition. Activities are led by students and teachers to help create a safe environment where everyone will feel like they have ownership in the school.
- Tours - parents are able to set up tours and learn about all the exciting programs and activities that Farnsworth Aerospace has to offer.
- Partnerships with TRIO and AVID at the Farnsworth Aerospace 5-8 Campus provides opportunities for students to experience visiting a college/university, learn skills/strategies for academic success, and help students make the connection between school and work.

<p>We work to make school meetings and events available for every family in the school.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● When sending out information, we create flyers and use automated calls that are translated into different languages. ● During conferences, we have night and day meetings for families. For family events, we communicate with our parents if childcare, food and transportation will be available depending on the event that is scheduled. ● One strategy that we will use during our large family events is having translators available to translate and provide the information from the event. ● Staff calling parents and inviting them to different family events will get students interested in the family event that is approaching. ● Interpreting Services(Hmong, Spanish, Karen, Somali) are available, please contact Family Liaison 1 week in advance. ● Parents may voice comments and concerns in the Front office with the Parent Comment Box. These topics of discussion will be held during the Monthly SCIT meetings (3rd Monday).

<p>Our school supports families as advocates and provides opportunities for parent leadership.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The process for parents to voice concerns about their child's learning is to contact their child's teacher. If there are further concerns, the parent should contact the principal. If the concern is not addressed, then a meeting with both the principal and teacher would be the next step. ● Staff will receive professional development around the interpretation of ACCESS scores for ELL students and will use this information to best meet the needs of individual students. This information will be shared with parents at conferences as teachers explain specific strategies that will help each ELL child develop their English language acquisition. ● Staff will continue to evaluate homework options that are expected to have a high learning impact. The Family Compact will be shared with staff so they are able to meet the documented expectations. ● Staff will participate in professional development around conferencing with families to reinforce the home-school connection. ● Families can get involved in planning for school improvement and family engagement by: Attending Parent Academy, FSO meetings on the second Monday of every month and School Climate Improvement Team meetings on the third Monday of every month, and by completing surveys. Families can also participate in creating and updating next year's Compact and Family Engagement Plan during the month of April. These will be distributed at the beginning of the school year and during conferences.
