I will:

work with students and their families to support student success in reading and math. By the end of fourth grade students are expected to:

Math:

- ✓ Classify polygons
- ✓ Know multiplication facts through 12
- ✓ Interpret a variety of graphs
- ✓ Solve multi-step math problems involving addition, subtraction, and multiplication
- ✓ Add and subtract fractions with like denominators
- ✓ Calculate the area of a rectangle
- ✓ Solve input/output rules

Reading:

- ✓ Reading with fluency, accuracy and comprehension at Mondo level "S"
- ✓ Refer to details and examples in the text and explain what the text means
- ✓ Determine the meaning of words and phrases used in text
- ✓ Make connections when reading
- ✓ Develop life-long reading skills

As a HPPA scholar I will:

- ✓ Complete and return homework packet by end of each week
- ✓ Bring my planner to and from school every day
- ✓ Work to the best of my ability
- ✓ Read every night for a minimum of 20 minutes
- ✓ Follow the school and classroom essential agreements (classroom rules)
- ✓ Bring home all notices and information about school events

At Home

HPPA parents will:

- ✓ Make sure our child arrives to school on time every day
- ✓ Call the school to report our child's absence
- ✓ Review our child's schoolwork, homework and sign their planner daily
- ✓ Read with our child/children every night
- ✓ Have fun with math- play games together and practice with flash cards
- ✓ Play words games, use during family conversations
- ✓ Attend conferences
- ✓ Attend PTO/meetings when possible
- ✓ Attend school program when possible
- ✓ Look for the classroom newsletter, school monthly newsletter and check out the school website
- ✓ Read information in Communications folder every Wednesday
